


Little Tots "At-Home-Work"



Hi everyone! This week our theme is Amazing Dinosaurs. Did you know, the word dinosaur means "Terrible Lizard"?

Remember to read every day and tell a story to your favorite Dinosaur.

Dinosaurs were huge animals that roamed the Earth thousands of years ago. They went **EXTINCT** long before people lived here, but we learned about them by finding their bones, (fossils) and putting the skeletons together, kind of like a puzzle. Using the play dough recipe on the Recreation website, make some play dough and take your toy dinosaurs and make some fossils.



Dinosaur Teeth. Paleontologist (Dinosaur Scientist) could tell what a dinosaur use to eat, by the shape of his teeth. Dinosaurs like the T-Rex, were carnivores (meat eaters) and had very sharp teeth. A T-Rex's teeth were pointy, like a triangle, and about the size of your hand. A Brontosaurus had flat teeth, more like your fist. You can glue popcorn kernels to a piece of cardboard or paper plate to make a Dino tooth fossil.

Dinosaur Feet. Dinosaurs had to have big, strong feet. They walked all day and slept standing up. Use the pattern attached or a pair of tissue boxes and make some Dinosaur feet. How do they feel to walk in. Would you like to sleep standing up?



There are no Dinosaurs alive today. Some people believe the Earth got too hot and the water dried up. Many dinosaurs got stuck in mud and couldn't get out. Let's see what you think. Mix up the slime recipe. Using plastic dinosaurs, or other small animals, try to figure out how that might have happened, or just have fun playing with the slime.

6 oz of glue, $\frac{1}{2}$ T baking soda, 1 1/2 T contact solution

Pour the glue into a bowl, add the baking soda and mix. Add the contact solution and mix well. When it starts to get firm, pick up and knead well. Enjoy You may need to add more solution to get the desired consistency. Store in a plastic bag.



Number 8 is pretty cool. It looks like it has a head and a body, Could you draw the number 8

So it looks like a Dinosaur? Let's practice with 8. Take 8 giant foot steps (like a dinosaur).


Stretch up tall on your tip toes 8 times, like a Brachiosaurus eating leaves from a tree. Jump from side to side 8 times, like you are trying to move out of the way of a running dinosaur. Look around your house and yard and find 8 places a dinosaur could sleep.

I said to the fourth dinosaur, “You stay back!”


The fifth big dinosaur went creep, creep, creep.

I said to the fifth dinosaur, “It’s time for sleep!”




