



Super Tots "At-Home-Work"

Wiggling Snakes Science

Large glass

Gummy snakes (you can also try other gummy snacks)

Baking soda

Vinegar


Add about 1/3 a cup of baking soda to a glass of warm water. Stir until mostly dissolved. Cut the gummy snakes into about four pieces each vertically, exposing the sticky insides. Drop the snakes into the baking soda mixture. Wait 20 minutes.

Fill a glass with vinegar. Drop the gummy snakes into the vinegar one at a time. They will wiggle and move and seemingly come to life. When one snake stops moving, add another to the jar.

Wiggling Snakes Science Explained


When you soak the snakes in the baking soda solution, the baking soda is infused into the gummy snack. When the snakes are dropped into the glass of vinegar, the snakes bubble and fizz when the acid of the vinegar reacts with the base of the baking soda. The carbon dioxide produced makes the snakes wiggle just like snakes that are alive.

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Cut this pattern from heavy paper and staple it to a paper headband.


Fold the visor along the dotted lines and fold the teeth downward.

Alligator Visor




A Frog's Life



A frog begins its life as an egg. It floats in water with many others.





Next the tadpole grows legs. Its tail gets smaller. It needs to breathe air.





Now the frog can live on land or in the water. It has strong legs to jump and webbed feet to swim.





The frog uses its long, sticky tongue to catch food. It eats insects and worms.





