Program Overview

Tiny Tots Program Philosophy

We believe that the preschool years are crucial to children's enjoyment of a full life in succeeding years. Your child's preschool experience should foster their emotional, social, physical, and intellectual development for lifelong learning. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded curriculum designed to meet children's developmental needs in an atmosphere of fun, respect, and understanding!

Benefits of Tiny Tots

Our goal is to help develop whole and happy children. We aim to create a classroom environment that enhances children's growth in self-confidence, responsibility, and independence. With warm, positive guidance from staff and parents, we can expect to see these results!

Our Learning Environment

Children learn through play, social interaction, exploration, and instruction. Daily activities include all of these aspects of learning, both inside and outside the classroom. Classroom activities include, but are not limited to: music, creative movement, art, science, social interaction, cultural awareness, language, math, prewriting, pre-reading, field trips, and dramatic play.

Parent Helping Days

We believe that optimal growth can occur when parents and teachers work cooperatively. Please keep in mind that parents are **REQUIRED** to help in the classroom at least one day per month in Little Tots and Super Tots classes. ***At this time, in order to keep stable groups, parent helpers will not be permitted in the classroom.***

Choosing the Right Class

Children are placed in classes that are age appropriate during the regular school year.

Wee Tots – An introduction to preschool, parents and children (18 months to 3 ½ years) will explore the classroom through various activities, craft projects, and circle time. Parent participation is required.

Little Tots – A class specifically designed for 3 and 4 year olds to learn through a variety of first time foundational experiences such as social interaction, explorative play, and basic academic concepts.

Super Tots – Designed for older 4 and 5 year olds expected to attend kindergarten the following year, the curriculum is based on the common core standards in preparation for kindergarten.

Summer Tots – Designed specifically for the summer, this camp is more relaxed with a greater focus on creative expression, outdoor exploratory experiences, and theme-based activities. A wide variety of activities will be included such as arts and crafts, games, music/dramatic play, as well as sensory and skill building activities.

License Exempt

The Tiny Tots Preschool Program is operated by the City of Escondido Community Services Department, Recreation Division, which is also known as Escondido Recreation. Tiny Tots is a public recreation program and not a daycare program, it is therefore exempt from licensing by the State of California.

Program Eligibility

The following outlines the specific eligibility requirements for each of the Tiny Tots Program classes.

All Classes

- ★ Children must be the minimum age by the first day of class
- ★ Children may not have attended kindergarten
- ★ Children must be FULLY potty trained and take care of his/her own toileting needs (no pull-ups, teachers and classroom helpers are not permitted to assist the children in the restroom – Wee Tots are exempt)
- ★ Little Tots & Super Tots – Complete all written registration materials contained in this packet (must be completed prior to attendance), no online registration
- ★ Wee Tots, Discovery Tots, and Summer Tots may register online
- ★ Children must exhibit acceptable personal and group interaction behaviors

Super Tots Classes

- ★ Should possess academic and social skills required for the completion of the Little Tots class
- ★ Expecting to attend Kindergarten the following year (Fall 2021)

Yearlong Program

Little Tots and Super Tots are considered a continuous yearlong program that is divided into monthly classes for the ease of payment. Therefore, participants are enrolled for the duration of the 2020/2021 school year. Eligibility for each subsequent month's class must be maintained in order to continue in the program (i.e. monthly payments). Failure to do so may result in disenrollment for the remainder of the year, loss of priority registration status, and/or any associated reinstatement fees.

Enrollment Priority Status

Little Tots and Super Tots priority enrollment eligibility for 2020/2021 to current participants of the Tiny Tots Program based on the following criteria:

Priority Enrollment (July 13, 2020) – Must be currently enrolled in Little Tots, Super Tots, or at least 2 prior sessions of the Wee Tots classes

Advanced Enrollment (July 13, 2020) – Must be enrolled in any Tiny Tots Program during summer which include Summer Tots or two (2) sessions of Wee Tots.

Open Enrollment (July 13, 2020) – Open to any new participant that meets the minimum qualifications of the program.

- ★ Super Tots (4-5 years) – Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays, 12:30p – 3:00p
- ★ Super Tots (4-5 years) – Tuesdays & Thursdays, 12:30a – 3:00p
- ★ Little Tots (3-4 years) – Tuesdays & Thursdays, 8:30a – 10:30a
- ★ Little Tots (3-4 years) – Wednesdays & Fridays, 8:30a – 10:30a
- ★ Wee Tots (18 months-3½ years) – Mondays, 9:00a – 10:30a

Summer Classes (summer 2021)

- ★ Summer Tots (3-5 years) – Mondays & Wednesdays, 9:00a – 1:00p
- ★ Summer Tots (3-5 years) – Tuesdays & Thursdays, 9:00a – 1:00p

Field Trips

The Tiny Tots program may offer opportunities for additional field trips to various locations such as the Pumpkin Patch, Safari Park, Dixon Lake, Children’s Museum, and an elementary school for Super Tots participants. See your teacher for possible upcoming trips as an incorporated part of the curriculum. ***At this time, in order to maintain a healthy, safe program environment, field trips will not be a part of the curriculum this year.***

Fee & Registration Information

Program Fees

The Tiny Tots Preschool Program (Little Tots and Super Tots) is considered a yearlong program that is divided into monthly payment installments. Please note the following fees per month.

- Wee Tots – \$23-\$45, 2-4 weeks/class
- Little Tots (T/TH & W/F) – \$99-\$125 per month
- Super Tots (M/W/F) – \$155-\$199 per month
- Super Tots (T/Th) – \$110-\$143 per month
- Summer Tots – \$98-\$110, 3 weeks/camp

Forms of Payment

In person payments only accepted at City Hall or EVCC

- ★ Credit Card: Visa, MasterCard, AMEX, or Discover
- ★ Personal Check
- ★ Cash

Payment Options

- ★ *Automatic Payment:* Tuition payments can be automatically charged each month from your credit or debit card on the due date.
- ★ *Walk-in:* You may pay in person at either the Community Services Department at City Hall or the East Valley Community Center.

Processing Fee

All customers will incur a processing fee for each transaction. This charge is the result of proprietary software used by Escondido Recreation as a part of our class registration system. Escondido Recreation does not set the cost of the processing fee, it cannot be waived, and is nonrefundable.

Late Payment/Reinstatement Fee

Participants that miss the established payment deadlines (see calendar for details) are subject to a \$25 Late Payment/Reinstatement Fee. This includes participants that reenroll into the program throughout the 2020/2021 school year that defer enrollment or skip months.

Late Pick-up Fee

Participants that are not picked up from class shall be subject to late fees. Late fees are charged \$1 per minute, per participant, with the first 5-minutes waived. Habitual tardiness or individuals that remain longer than 30-minutes could result in dismissal from the program.

Parent Participation Fee

Families are expected to volunteer in the classroom a minimum of once per month. Individuals that are unable to fulfill this requirement will be subject to a \$20 Parent Participation Fee for each missed occurrence. ***At this time, in order to keep stable groups, parent helpers will not be permitted in the classroom.***

Refund Policy

- ★ If you are unable to attend the monthly session after you have registered, you may request a refund or credit on account.

- ★ Refunds/credit on account will not be granted for individual classes missed during a monthly session.
- ★ If a class is cancelled by the Department, you will be given the choice of a transfer (based on available space), credit on account, or refund without a service charge.
- ★ If you choose credit on account, you will receive credit for 100% of the class fees minus any classes attended or missed. The credit will expire one year from the day your account was credited. Refund requests will be assessed a service charge of 25% of the fees paid for classes, minus any missed or attended classes.
- ★ All requests for refunds or credit on account must be made prior to the last class.

Program Registration

Parents are responsible for registering their child for the Tiny Tots Preschool program by completing all the necessary paperwork and agreeing to the terms of enrollment contained in this packet. When registering for the Tiny Tots Preschool Program (Little Tots & Super Tots), please ensure that you bring the following items with you to complete your registration packet:

- ★ Completed Emergency Card
- ★ Completed Liability Waiver
- ★ Signed Parent Agreement
- ★ Proof of Child's Age
- ★ Registration Fees (first month)

2020/2021 Tiny Tots Parent Agreement

- ★ Children must be at least three (3) years old and potty-trained to attend the Tiny Tots Preschool Program.
- ★ Please be on time for both drop-off and pick-up of your child. If you are late to pick up your child, you will be charged late fees (\$1 per minute).
- ★ Children should be dressed in clothing that can get dirty and can be easily pulled up and down so they can use the restroom without the help of staff or parents.
- ★ For safety reasons, children should only wear close-toed shoes.
- ★ Your child should bring a small, healthy snack or lunch, check with your teacher for details.
- ★ One parent (or responsible adult) must help in the classroom one day per month. Parents who do not fulfill their required helping days will lose their priority registration status. The day you help in class is also your child's "share" day (show-and-tell day). Please do not bring younger siblings to class on your helping day. Families unable to fulfill this requirement may be subject to an associated fee or dropped from the program. **At this time, in order to keep stable groups, parent helpers will not be permitted in the classroom.**
- ★ Sick children should stay home for their sake and the health of others. Please refer to the health policy in the Parent Handbook for the detailed health requirements.
- ★ All children, parents, and staff members should be treated with courtesy, understanding, and respect.
- ★ If your child has functional needs, please inform the teacher of those needs and complete an Inclusion Support Form for Minors, if necessary.
- ★ All fees for each consecutive class must be paid by the second Friday of the month prior. Fees that are not paid by the due date will be assessed \$25 Late Payment/Reinstatement Fee (this will also apply to any failed automatic payments). The Late Payment/Reinstatement Fee may be waived only once during the school year.
- ★ Your child will be dropped from the program and you will lose your enrollment eligibility status if payment is not made by the Thursday following the due date. To reenroll your child into the program the mentioned \$25 Late Payment/Reinstatement Fee will apply. If space in the program is no longer available, you may place your child's name on the waiting list.

COVID-19 Waiver of Liability and Assumption of Risk Agreement

In consideration of participation in any City of Escondido Recreation Activity, hereinafter called the "Program", I acknowledge and agree as follows:

1. My or my child's participation in the Program is voluntary, and I choose to enroll myself or my child in the Program in accordance with and subject to the following terms:

- I understand and acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume all such risk that I or my child may be exposed to or infected with COVID-19 through participation in the Program, and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability and/or death.
I understand and acknowledge there may be additional programs running at the same time as the Program in distinctly separate spaces. If the Program requires a set, limited number of participants ("Stable Groups"), at no time will participants from one Stable Group be allowed to intermingle with or move between other Stable Groups. Per the San Diego County Public Health Order and protocols (the "Protocols"), if Stable Groups are required, I or my child must remain in the assigned Stable Group throughout the Program.
I understand and acknowledge that I or my child cannot attend the Program with a body temperature above 100° F or if exhibiting any COVID-19 symptoms based on CDC guidelines. All staff and participants will be required to undergo a contactless temperature reading when they arrive and during the duration of the Program. Masks are mandatory for staff, parents, and participants unless Stable Groups are required. Masks will be optional for participants once in their Stable Group.
I understand and acknowledge if I have or my child has displayed COVID-19 symptoms, I or my child will not be allowed to participate in the Program until I have or my child has tested negative for COVID-19 and can provide a medical professional's clearance; or at least 10 days have passed since the onset of symptoms, and at least three (3) days (72 hours) have passed since recovery, including no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication.
I understand and acknowledge parents or guardians are permitted to drop off and pick up their children from the Program. Parents or guardians not participating in the Program may not remain onsite of the Program for any reason. Unless children are from the same household they may not carpool to or from the Program.
I attest that I or my child will refrain from unnecessary physical contact with others during the Program, including hugs, high-fives, and fist pumps, which are not permitted per the Protocols. I or my child will wash and/or sanitize my/his/her hands frequently throughout the day. Staff will provide sanitation stations, but it is also encouraged that participants bring their own hand sanitizer.
(For Camp Programs) I understand and acknowledge children are required to bring their own snacks and lunch to the Program, and are recommended to bring their own personal water bottle. All personal items must be kept within the area for each Stable Group and items must be six (6) feet from each other.
I attest that I have or my child has reviewed and understand(s) the attached document that identifies the best practices to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

2. By signing below, I understand and voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury or loss to me or my child resulting from participation in the Program, including but not limited to, personal injury, disability, illness, death, damage, loss, or expense of any kind. I do hereby release, waive, and discharge the City of Escondido ("City"), its officers, agents, and employees ("City Releases") from liability and any and all claims, including the negligence of the City or the City Releases, resulting from participation in the Program.



CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)



Fact Sheet

What is coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)?

COVID-19 is a new coronavirus not previously identified in humans. Coronaviruses are a category of viruses normally found in animals, but some can evolve and infect humans.

Coronaviruses can infect your nose, sinuses, or upper throat. This specific coronavirus was first identified as the cause of an outbreak of respiratory illness in Wuhan, China in December 2019 and was officially named COVID-19 on February 11, 2020 by the World Health Organization (WHO).

What are the symptoms of COVID-19?

People with COVID-19 can have no symptoms, mild symptoms, or severe illness. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- New loss of taste or smell
- Body aches
- Runny nose
- Congestion
- Headache
- Sore throat

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure. Visit [CDC.gov/coronavirus](https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus) for a complete list of symptoms and call your doctor if you are experiencing any symptoms.

Who is at risk for COVID-19?

Risk is based on exposure and a variety of factors that may vary, including the community in which you live, places you have visited, interactions you have had, and your line of work.

Anyone can get COVID-19. Illness in people infected with the virus has ranged from no illness to being mildly sick to being severely ill and dying.

Groups at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 if infected include:

- People 65 years old and older
- People who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility
- People of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions, especially if their medical condition is not well controlled.

How is COVID-19 spread?

COVID-19 is thought to be spread mainly from person-to-person:

- Between people who are in close contact with each other (within 6 feet/2 meters);
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person sneezes, coughs, or talks.
- These droplets can be breathed in by people nearby or land in their mouth, nose, or other surface.
- It may be possible to get COVID-19 by touching an object or surface with the virus on it, then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes before washing your hands.

People can have COVID-19 and not have any symptoms or not yet be showing symptoms but are still able to spread the virus to others.



How is COVID-19 treated?

Treatments for COVID-19 are being studied. Investigational medications may be recommended for those infected with COVID-19 depending on their individual condition. Following supportive care guidance, such as getting plenty of rest, staying hydrated, and taking on over-the-counter medication for fever and pain can help relieve symptoms. There is currently no vaccine available to protect against COVID-19.

What should I do if I think I have been exposed to COVID-19?

If you have had close contact (within 6 feet/2 meters) with someone who is confirmed to have, or is being evaluated for COVID-19 infection, you should:

- Quarantine yourself in your home and away from others for 14 days, starting from the day you first had close contact with the infected person and continue for 14 days after you last had close contact with the person.
- Call your healthcare provider and follow their medical advice.
- Watch for symptoms and contact your healthcare provider if you develop any symptoms.



How can I protect myself?

The best way to prevent getting sick is to avoid being exposed to the virus. Actions that can help prevent the spread of COVID-19 include:

- Washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds; if soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol;
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands;
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces often.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick;
- Stay home and isolate yourself away from others if you are sick;
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, or your elbow, then throw the tissue in the trash;
- Practice social distancing (maintaining 6 feet of physical space between yourself and others);
- Wear a face cover when you are around individuals outside of your household.
